I. Goals and Objectives

The following Goals and Objectives were completed during FY 2010:

Further CAD/RMS and Computer Development:

- Install Mapping Software Elements to support Crime Analysis – Crime Reports is up and running for public view on the Dennis Police Web Site
- Landlord Notification System – is installed and running
- The Detective Division has been trained and is using the Investigative module and case Management functions of the IMC system
- The Department is participating with Town IT department to upgrade the web page

Training - Uniform – Equipment Issues:

- The Department is conducting some training using the Distance Learning programs through the Municipal Police Institute
- Firearms training now conducted on a twice-per-year basis
- Tow Department officers have completed Taser Instructor program and policy being developed

Emergency Management:

- Regional sheltering plan development continues – regional shelters opened for December storm and state grant completed and submitted
- Yarmouth CERT (Citizen Emergency Response Team) program now a regional program with Dennis police and fire participation. Grant applications pending

III. Patrol, Community Policing, Emergency Management and Traffic Initiatives

A. Traffic Issues

- Attended monthly Road Safety Task Force meetings
- Attended Mariner Road meeting with other Town Department's to discuss the speed bump request by local Mariner Road residents;
- Officers attended monthly meetings of the CCRLEC Accident Reconstruction Unit and attended the "Human Factors" class in April;
- Continued deployment of Traffic Speed Trailer and Message Board;
- 11 Car seat installations conducted;
- Officers sponsored a 3-Day Safety Belt Pledge Drive held at Dennis Yarmouth High School in May prior to the Prom and took part in the annual DY High School "Mock Crash" presentation prior to graduation;
- Officers assisted the Registry of Motor Vehicles at the Dennis Yarmouth High School with their annual "Operation Graduation" vehicle checkpoint for seat belts and cell phone use
- EOPSS- Click it or Ticket Grant Mobilization May 24th to June 7th conducted;
- The Department sponsored the AAA "Older Wiser Driver" Seminar held at the Dennis Senior Center;
- Dennis Police ATV Officers assisted the Department of Natural Resources on Holiday Evenings and early morning hours at Crows Pasture.
- Radar enforcement for the quarter of just under 100 hours and speeding citations totaled just over \$3,000.00.

B. Proactive Crime Prevention and Directed Patrols

- Directed patrol was conducted with a warrant apprehension team of Dennis Officers. Officers located subjects in Dennis who had outstanding warrants which included narcotic violations;
- Directed patrol was conducted by Dennis Officers by going to liquor stores in Dennis to identify proper identification techniques by store employees;
- 2 Directed patrols were conducted at Flax Pond Conservation parking lot area, off of Setucket Road, to combat the continued car breaks and larcenies occurring there;
- 2 Directed patrols were conducted at southside beach parking areas lot to combat drug sale activity;
- Enforcement and public education activities conducted to combat continued car break activities in all areas of town;
- Officer Downs and Reinold attended 4-day Massachusetts Association of Crime Analysts training;
- Weekly publication of the Mid- Cape (Yarmouth, Barnstable and Dennis) Crime Analysis bulletin continues;
- Officer Downs and Victim Witness Coordinator working with TRIAD to implement the "Lock Box Program";
- Both Crime Prevention officers conducted meetings with their Neighborhood Watch groups such as Sesuit Neck Property Owners, Nobscussett Crime Watch, Forest Pines Crime Watch, Dennisport Neighborhood Watch Group, South Side Civic and Dennisport Revitalization group;

- Officer Kelley conducted an Identity Theft presentation to the VASA women's group at the Senior Center;
- Officers from Dennis and Yarmouth Police Departments assisted School personnel with School Lock Downs in schools in both towns

C. Emergency Management

- Department personnel attended the monthly BCREPC and Regional Sheltering meetings;
- Captain Monahan and Officer Kelley attended the Incident Command System 400 Training in April;
- Officer Kelley attended the MAIAAI, "Large Event Scene Management" training in June;
- Sgt. DiMatteo attended annual NSTAR emergency Response Plan Meeting held in Hyannis

B. Detective Unit

- The Detective Division had 73 Cases assigned during the second quarter of 2010.
- There are a total of 36 sex offenders registered with the department. All are classified. There are 6 - level 1, 25 - level 2 and 5 level 3 offenders. Addresses checked and confirmed during the quarter.

C. Victim Services

- Victim/ Witness assistance continues to follow up on calls for service:
 - Domestic Violence calls 59
 - Dailey Offenses 243
 - Calls for Service 245
 - Arrests 23
 - Restraining Orders 50
- Volunteers in Police Services (VIP's) volunteered over 997 hours this quarter as greeters or reassurance callers

D. Recruitment

- The Department completed a recruitment drive during the quarter, visiting over a dozen college campuses to publicize the recruit test;
- Recruit test held in June at DY High School – 140 applicants took the test
- Interviews and backgrounds of selected individuals to be conducted in 3rd Quarter of 2010.
